

## The State of Industry 2005 to 2015: County Business Patterns of Pennsylvania

This product includes a ready-to-use dataset including 2005, 2010, and 2015 data on the number of establishments, the number of employees, and the annual payroll for 19 industries in Pennsylvania for each county. The annual payrolls for 2005 and 2010 have been inflation adjusted to 2015 dollars, and percent change has been calculated for each county and industry.

A report published by the Data Center is also included which addresses broad trends in the and also counties experiencing large changes.

### **2016 Detailed State and County Population Estimates**


Pennsylvania's population continues to age past the mid-decade as the population age 55 years and over grew by 12.5 percent from 2010 to 2016 and greatly outpaced the growth of the general population (0.6 percent) according to the 2016 Detailed State and County Population Estimates released this month. Members of the Baby Boomer or older generations now constitute 31.5 percent of Pennsylvania's population.

The Hispanic or Latino (of all races) and non-Hispanic Asian alone populations were Pennsylvania's fastest growing racial/ethnic subgroups with increases of 25.2 percent and 23.2 percent respectively. For more information about county population change in PA, click here.

### The State of Industry: 2005 to 2015

Pennsylvania experienced a net loss of over 3,600 business establishments from 2005 to 2015 according to the newly released 2015 County Business Patterns data from the U.S. Census Bureau. Despite the shrinking number of establishments, the Commonwealth's economy gained nearly 225,000 employees and the annual payroll of business increase d by over \$27 billion (2015 inflation-adjusted dollars). #### Quarterly Summary of State and Local Government Tax Revenues: Q1, 2017

The summary provides quarterly estimates of state and local government tax revenue at a national level as well as detailed tax revenue data for individual states. Three tables provide income and sales data as well as tax collections by state.

#### 2016 Characteristics of New Housing

This release provides annual statistics on the characteristics of new privately owned residential structures by census region. The report includes characteristics such as the number of bedrooms and bathrooms, the location of the laundry, presence of homeowner's association, the buyer's source of financing and the structure's square footage.

#### 2013 Wealth and Asset Ownership

These tables highlight annual household net worth estimates at the national level and are broken down by selected characteristics, such as race, household structure and poverty status.

#### 2015 E-Stats Report

This report summarizes 2015 e-commerce statistics on shipments, sales and revenues from four sectors of the economy: manufacturing, wholesale, services and retail. These statistics are available from 1998.
