LGBT Pride Month

June is LGBT Pride Month, a month-long observance dedicated to the lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender¹ members of our communities in honor of the Stonewall riots in 1969. The U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey provides characteristics of same-sex households for the nation by age, race, Hispanic origin, education, employment, presence of children, and income.

Same-sex households across the nation are older, less racially and ethnically diverse, more educated, and have higher rates of employment and median household incomes than opposite-sex households.

There were over 32,000 same-sex households in Pennsylvania in 2016, which represented less than 1 percent (0.7%) of total households in the state. Over half (53.7%) of same-sex households in Pennsylvania were married, same-sex households.

Detailed 2017 population estimates are now available for the nation, state, and counties including the breakdowns by age, sex, race, and Hispanic origin. Population estimates are now available for all municipalities in 2017 also.

New Annual Business Survey (ABS) Announced


The ABS is a new survey that replaces three existing surveys: the Survey of Business Owners (SBO), the Annual Survey of Entrepreneurs (ASE), and the Business Research and Development and Innovation Survey for Microbusinesses (BRDI-M). The ABS will provide statistics on minority-owned business estimates and measure other business and business owner characteristics such as firms, receipts, payroll and employment by demographic characteristics such as gender, race, ethnicity and veteran status.

Nonemployment Statistics for 2016 Available

Newly released nonemployer statistics are now available for the year 2016. Nonemployer Statistics is an annual series that provides subnational economic data for businesses that have no paid employees and are subject to federal income tax. The data consist of the number of nonemployer establishments and receipts by over 450 NAICS industries at the national, state, county, MSA, and CBSA levels.
