




# DATA CENTER NEWS

## **ASIAN-PACIFIC HERITAGE MONTH**

May represents a month-long observance dedicated to Asian-Pacific Heritage. This month, we explore income and region of origin for Pennsylvania's foreign born Asian population with the 2016 American Community Survey. There were just over 128,000 working-age, foreign born Asians in Pennsylvania from 2012 to 2016. Approximately half (51.1%) of foreign born individuals from all regions of Asia made at least \$50,000 from 2012 to 2016.

***Distribution of Foreign Born Asians by Income and Region of Origin***



Those from South Central Asia had the highest proportion of its population with earnings over \$50,000 (61.5%) while those from South East Asia had the lowest proportion (36.7%). Foreign born persons with Eastern Asian and Western Asian origins fell between (at 48.1% and 53.3%, respectively).


### 2016 County Business Patterns Released

#### **State and County Detailed Population Estimates: 2016**

This publication provides detailed population estimates by gender and age for the state and counties. Age data is broken into one-year cohorts for ages 0 to 19, 5-year cohorts for ages 0 to 84, and a single cohort for age 85 and older. Population estimates by race and Hispanic origin are available at the state level.

#### **The State of Industry, 2005 to 2015: Business Patterns of PA**

This product includes an inflation-adjusted, analysis-ready dataset including 2005, 2010, and 2015 data on the number of establishments, the number of employees, and the annual payroll of Pennsylvania's 19 major industries down to the county level as well as a state-level summary report.
