Same-sex couple households with no relatives of the householder present are tabulated in nonfamily households. "Nonfamily households" consist of people living alone and households which do not have any members related to the householder.

[9] The rental vacancy rate is the proportion of the rental inventory that is vacant "for rent." It is computed by dividing the total number of vacant units "for rent." by the sum of the renteroccupied units, vacant units that are "for rent," and vacant units that have been rented but not yet occupied; and then multiplying by 100.
