Pennsylvania's Gross State Product Continues to Increase

MIDDLETOWN, Pa— Pennsylvania ranked sixth in the nation in gross state product (GSP) in 1998, with a GSP of \$364.039 billion, reports the Pennsylvania State Data Center, located at Penn State Harrisburg.

Data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis show that between 1997 and 1998 Pennsylvania's gross state product increased 4.9 percent. Adjusting for 1998 dollars, the Commonwealth's GSP has continually increased over the past twenty years.

Gross state product (GSP) is the market value of final goods and services produced by labor and property located in a state. Gross state product is often considered the state counterpart to gross domestic product (GDP), the output of goods and services produced by labor and property located in the United States. Pennsylvania's GSP increased 4.9 percent from 1997 and 62.1 percent from 1988. However, this was less

than the percent change in GDP for the nation.

Total GDP for 1998 was \$8,790.2 billion

The largest percentage of Pennsylvania's GSP was generated from the services industry, followed by manufacturing and finance, insurance and real estate.
