## **Pennsylvania State Data Center Announces 2002 Annual Data User Conference**

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – The Pennsylvania State Data Center, located at Penn State Harrisburg, is hosting its annual Data User Conference on Tuesday, September 17<sup>th</sup>, 2002, at the Holiday Inn Grantville. The conference is designed to educate and inform a diverse audience of data users on how to obtain and utilize data to meet the challenges of the new millennium. Along with a plenary session, luncheon and keynote speaker, the day will include nineteen breakout sessions with special emphasis on Census 2000 data.

This year's plenary speaker will be Pennsylvania Public Utilities Commission Chairman Glenn Thomas. Chairman Thomas will speak on telephone competition in Pennsylvania.

The keynote speaker will be Mr. Mark Mather from the Population Reference Bureau in Washington, D.C. Mr. Mather is a policy analyst for the Population Reference Bureau and will speak on the Census 2000 Supplemental Survey with a special focus on Pennsylvania's children.
