2005 County Business Patterns Released

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – Pennsylvania saw an increase in 1,776 business establishments with paid employees between 2004 and 2005, according to the recently-released U.S. Census Bureau report, *County Business Patterns: 2005*. Though the number of business establishments increased, the total number of paid employees decreased by 24,414, or a 0.5 percent loss.

County Business Patterns: 2005 provides data by county on the number of establishments, number of employees, and payroll information for business with paid employees. Data are obtained from Census Bureau reports and administrative records from other federal agencies. Certain businesses are excluded from the report, including agricultural workers, people who are self-employed, and most government employees.

Union County saw the largest percent change in the number of employer business establishments between 2004 and 2005, a 5.6 percent increase, or 48 more establishments than in 2004. Chester County had the largest numeric increase in employer business establishments, with an increase of 330 businesses with paid employees. Chester County also saw the largest increase in paid employees, with 9,848 more employees in 2005 than in 2004.

Total payroll for Pennsylvania employers in 2005 was up 4.4 percent, to \$189,692,284. Philadelphia and Chester Counties saw the largest numeric increase in payroll from 2004 to 2005, with Philadelphia increasing \$1,420,977, or a 6.0 percent increase, and Chester's total payroll growing by \$1,352,403, a 13.2 percent increase. Greene County saw the largest percent increase in payroll between 2004 and 2005, with a 21.0 percent increase (\$54,072).

Allegheny (34,487), Philadelphia (26,610), and Montgomery (26,274) Counties had the largest number of total employer business establishments of all Pennsylvania Counties. The same counties were also the top three in the state in terms of total number of paid employees, as well: Allegheny (671,670), Philadelphia (567,656) and Montgomery (482,042).

The Health Care and Social Assistance industry group employed more people in Pennsylvania in 2005 than any other, with 837,643 employees. The Retail Trade industry



group, however, had more total employer business establishments, with 47,223 establishments.

The Health Care and Social Assistance industry group also added more jobs between 2004 and 2005 than any other major industry group, a total of 14,819, or a 1.8 percent change. The Real Estate, Rental and Leasing industry group had the largest percent change in employment between 2004 and 2005, with a 3.0 percent increase, a total of 2,035 new employees.

Decrease in Pennsylvania Businesses

Pennsylvania saw a net decrease in the number of paid employees from 2004 to 2005. A number of counties also saw a decrease in the total number of employees, led by Montgomery and Philadelphia Counties, which saw a decrease of 14,665 and 11,299 employees, respectively. Cameron and Dauphin Counties saw the largest percent decrease in employees between 2004 and 2005, -7.4 percent and -7.1 percent respectively.

The Construction and Retail Trade industry groups saw the largest numeric loss in employment, with 14,093 and 9,263 fewer employees in 2005 than in 2004. In terms of percent change, the Forestry, Fishing, Hunting and Agricultural Support industry group lost the largest proportion of employees (among industries with classifications) between 2004 and 2005, decreasing 12.6 percent.

Among industries with a classification, the Finance and Insurance industry group and Manufacturing industry group saw the largest numeric decrease in total number of establishments in the 2004-2005 year: Finance and Insurance had 414 fewer establishments in 2005, while Manufacturing had 291 fewer. The largest proportional decrease among Pennsylvania industry establishments with classifications was seen in the Forestry, Fishing, Hunting and Agricultural Support industry group, with a 7.3 percent decrease in total employer establishments between 2004 and 2005.
