## 2006 County Business Patterns Released

MIDDLETOWN, Pa – Pennsylvania saw an increase of 725 business establishments with paid employees between 2005 and 2006, according to the recently-released U.S. Census Bureau report, County Business Patterns: 2006. As the number of business establishments increased, the total number of paid employees also increased, adding 107,319 employees or a 2.1 percent gain.

County Business Patterns: 2006 provides data by county on the number of establishments, number of employees, and payroll information for businesses with paid employees. Data is obtained from Census Bureau reports and administrative records from other federal agencies. Certain businesses are excluded from the report, including agricultural workers, people who are self-employed, and most government employees.

Adams County saw the largest percent change in the number of employer business establishments between 2005 and 2006, a 2.9 percent increase, or 57 more establishments than in 2005. Montgomery County had the largest numeric increase in employer business establishments, with an increase of 219 businesses with paid employees. Montgomery County also saw the largest increase in paid employees, with 14,527 more employees in 2006 than in 2005.

Total payroll for Pennsylvania employers in 2006 was up 5.7 percent, to over \$200 billion. Montgomery and Allegheny Counties saw the largest numeric increase in payroll from 2005 to 2006, with Montgomery increasing \$1.8 billion or a 7.5 percent increase, and Allegheny's total payroll growing by \$1.4 billion, a 5.2 percent increase. Cameron County saw the largest percent increase in payroll between 2005 and 2006, with a 39.2 percent increase (\$17,502,000).

Allegheny (34,800), Philadelphia (26,567), and Montgomery (26,493) Counties had the largest number of total employer business establishments of all Pennsylvania Counties. The same counties were also the top three in the state in terms of total number of paid employees, as well: Allegheny (675,939), Philadelphia (579,964) and Montgomery (496,569).

The Health Care and Social Assistance industry group employed more people in Pennsylvania in 2006 than any other industry group, with 860,829 employees. The Retail

Trade industry group, however, had more total employer business establishments, with 46,660 establishments.

The Health Care and Social Assistance industry group also added more jobs between 2005 and 2006 than any other major industry group, a total of 23,186, or a 2.8 percent change. The Transportation & Warehousing industry group had the largest percent increase in employment (6.4 percent) between 2005 and 2006, adding a total of 12,532 new employees.

### **Decrease in County Employment**

While Pennsylvania saw a net increase in the number of paid employees from 2005 to 2006, a number of counties saw a decrease in the total number of employees. Westmoreland and Bedford Counties had the largest decrease of employees, losing 857 and 469, respectively. Perry and Bedford Counties saw the largest percent decrease in employees between 2005 and 2006, -4.8 percent and -3.3 percent respectively.

The Management of Companies & Enterprises industry group saw the largest numeric loss in employment, with 3,884 fewer employees in 2006 than in 2005. In terms of percent change, the Utilities industry group lost the largest proportion of employees (among industries with classifications) between 2005 and 2006, decreasing 6.1 percent.

The Retail Trade industry group saw the largest numeric decrease in total number of establishments in the 2005-2006 year with 563 fewer establishments in 2006. The largest proportional decrease among Pennsylvania industry establishments with classifications was seen in the Forestry, Fishing, Hunting and Agricultural Support industry group, with a 6.6 percent decrease in total employer establishments between 2005 and 2006.
