2018 American Community Survey 1-Year Estimates Released

HARRISBURG – The U.S. Census Bureau today released a new set of estimates from the American Community Survey for the year 2018, providing new data for a variety of demographic and economic topics for the nation, states, and other areas with populations of 65,000 or more.

New Data Dissemination Platform

The 2018 American Community Survey 1-Year Estimates mark the first major release through the U.S. Census Bureau's new data dissemination platform at <u>data.census.gov</u>. These estimates will not be made available through American FactFinder, the U.S. Census Bureau's data tool for roughly 20 years. Note: After the release of the 2017 data, the U.S. Census Bureau identified an error in the data for Philadelphia County, PA which impacted estimates in Philadelphia City, Philadelphia County, and the Philadelphia-Camden-Wilmington, PA-NJ-DE-MD MSA for the following topics: employment status, health insurance, households and families, income and earnings, rent, and poverty. estimates, the value of owner-occupied units, educational attainment, non-English speakers, and access to broadband internet all had statistically significant increases between 2017 and 2018.

Other Notes Regarding the 2018 Release

A new table on family income by family size and receipt of cash public assistance income or food stamps/SNAP benefits in the past 12 months has been added to the survey providing data for two-person to seven-or-more person families (B19123).

Three new detailed tables provide detailed occupation estimates for the civilian employed population 16 and over (B24114), the male civilian employed population 16 and over (B24115), and the female civilian employed population 16 years and over (B24116).
